I chose to create a survey that I thought I could use practically as I begin working with private students. The obvious caveat here is that they would have to have some reading skills in English, so who knows how practical it would be?

I have taken surveys created with Survey Monkey, but hadn't made one of my own with this tool. I really liked the interface. I've used Google Forms in the past when working with students. I am looking forward to seeing how the data is presented with Survey Monkey.

Edited to add:

I've had the opportunity to review the data collected in my survey. I have realized over the last few years I really enjoy analyzing data and making inferences and drawing conclusions from it. Here's my take on this informal experience.

I designed this survey for potential students, but the results I collected in this class have helped me realize some things. Students learning English appear more intentional about finding opportunities to practice outside of the classroom when they are at the beginning stages (which seems pretty intuitive). Media - TV and radio/podcasts- is important, but so is social interaction. Learning these things will absolutely inform my approach when I work with students wishing to develop their English language skills. For one, I'll be more inclined to use video clips in my classes. These are natural, comfortable ways to focus on vocabulary and conventions. I'm not sure if anyone has seen This Way Up on Hulu - I love Sharon Horgan and British comedies! Aine is the protagonist and she teaches English to students in London. In one episode, she reviews family relationships using an episode of Keeping Up with the Kardashians. I thought that was both hysterical and brilliant (n.b. the show is a bit irreverent and mildly edgy). Assigning homework which involves watching segments or shows and debriefing could be valuable. The fact that social interactions are really important would inspire me to find as many ways as possible to incorporate opportunities for students to converse. In normal (non-Covid times), sharing food and celebrating holidays and other occasions would be an easy way to accomplish this. For adult students, I'd try to arrange meet-ups.

In the future, I'll definitely think of ways to incorporate surveys in my teaching. They are really informative!

There is no advertising interface or unnecessary information for the surveyed user to interfere with the survey. And the choice of free accounts is enough. Interestingly, the survey results can be displayed not only as pie charts and bar charts but also as line and radar charts. In addition to creating surveys, this site can also be used to take quizzes.

I would consider using this site in a classroom setting.

1) I would ask random questions in class for students to answer on their phones.

2) I would also have the students do three tasks in class. I would have the students use the surveys on this website after the three tasks to answer which task was the most interesting and which task was the most stressful for them.

Well, the caterers of the 76th Annual TESOL Awards Banquet have their work cut out for them. There were a variety of different question types, like multiple choice, text entry, or grading something on a scale from one to ten. Simple surveys can be made for free, and additional features are available for a paid membership.

I think online surveys can be useful in the classroom to gain student feedback, such as how easy or difficult the lessons are, and to see if the students' expectations are being met.




